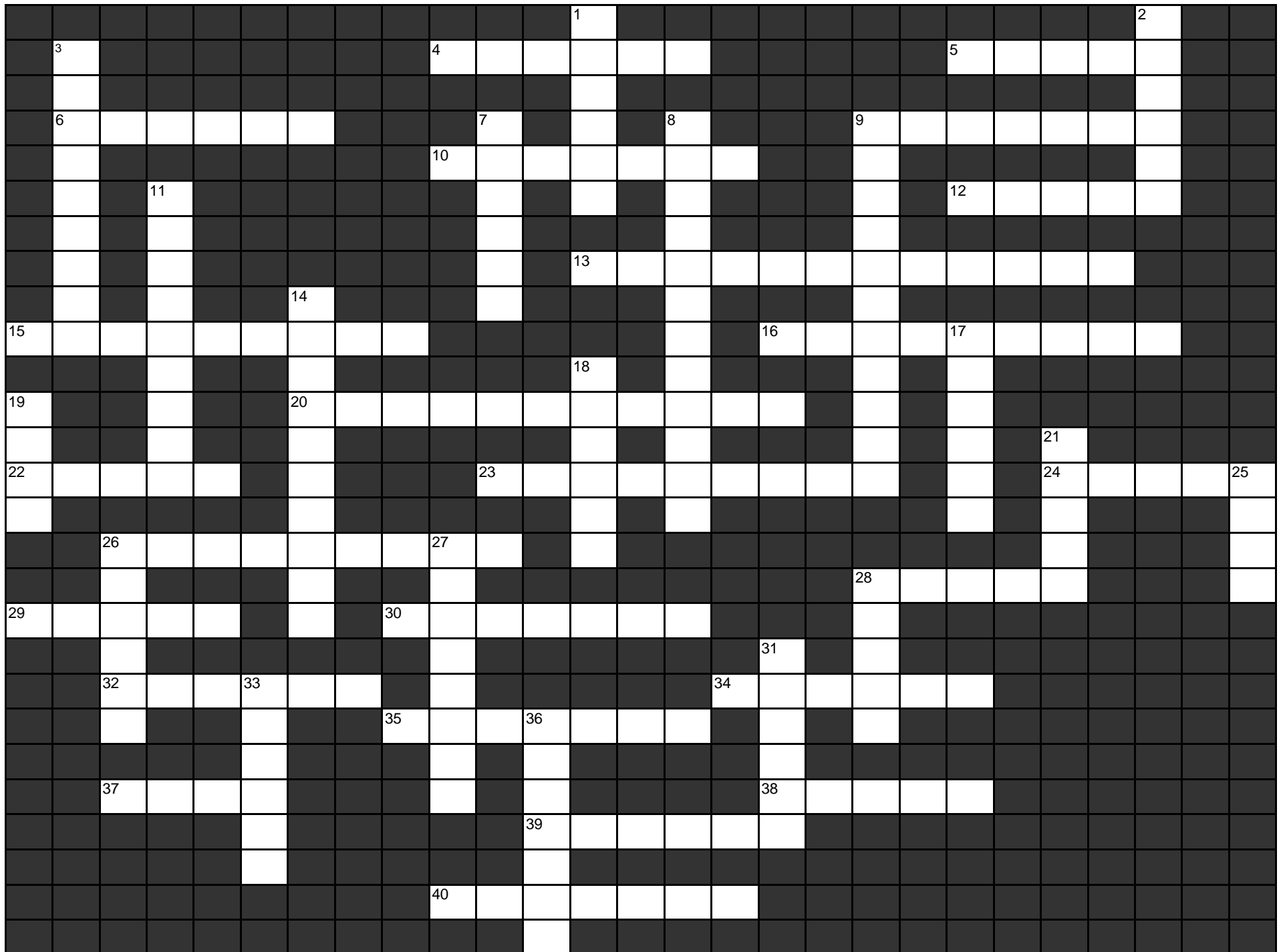

- 4 Family that owned a farm famous for its Morgan horses
- 5 Street where the old cow pound is located
- 6 He built the first house on Crane Neck Hill in 1709
- 9 Spring on Middle Street
- 10 Former name of Way to the River
- 12 Name of small lane between Church and Bridge Streets
- 13 Cemetery near Rocks Bridge (2 words)
- 15 Highest hill
- 16 Cemetery on Pleasant Street
- 20 Where West Newbury students went to high school before Pentucket
- 22 Started the comb industry at 127 Main Street
- 23 Hill where first church was built
- 24 Cemetery on Chase Street
- 26 Former name of Whetstone Street (on 1729 map)
- 28 His farm was the site of an Indian Raid in 1695
- 29 Builder and first resident of the Historical Society building
- 30 Church formerly on Main Street near Bridge Street, later used as a gymnasium
- 32 He killed an Indian in West Newbury
- 34 Hill partly in Newburyport
- 35 Invented the cross-cut saw and monorail, lived in West Newbury
- 37 Pond that flows into Indian River
- 38 First person to have a mill on the Artichoke River
- 39 Brook off Maple Street
- 40 Name of town in 1819

- 1 Present name of mill on Artichoke River
- 2 Hill where there was a famous nursery until about 2000
- 3 Name of the Civil War encampment on Pleasant Street
- 7 He left West Newbury, Mass., and founded West Newbury, Vermont (note unusual spelling)
- 8 Hill where the second church was built
- 9 Name of abandoned road between Garden and Turkey Hill Streets
- 11 Street where the cemetery for paupers was located
- 14 Cemetery on Bachelor Street (2 words)
- 17 Hill where Ben: Perley Poore lived
- 18 Name of hunt club that rides horses through West Newbury
- 19 Number of last district school used in West Newbury (spell the number)
- 21 Spring at corner of Main and Garden Streets
- 25 Hill with an apple orchard
- 26 Former president of Harvard College, born in West Newbury
- 27 Former name of Main Street
- 28 Hill with a ski tow in the early 1900s (watch the spelling!)
- 31 Church formerly on Rogers Street
- 33 He was the youngest police chief in the state in 1958
- 36 Name of town before 1819
